

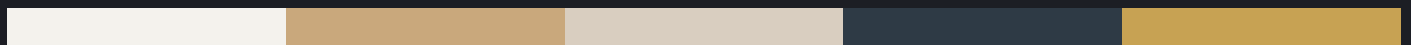

Hardware, plumbing and door details

A consistent metal family pulls the rooms together.

Choose samples in the room where they will live. Daylight, bulbs and nearby materials change how every finish reads.

A clear allowance process

Each category receives a written allowance based on the project scope and quantity.

1

Budget

Your contract carries a written category allowance based on the plans and project scope.

2

Compare

We review build level, performance, finish and lead time.

3

Approve

You approve the exact item, color and quantity in writing.

4

Reconcile

The final supplier cost is reconciled to the written allowance in the contract.

Printed swatches are references. Approve the exact manufacturer code from physical samples in project lighting.

WALLS

Flat or eggshell

Soft light response for bedrooms and living spaces.

BUSY ROOMS

Eggshell or satin

Washable choice for kitchens, baths and halls.

TRIM

Satin or semi-gloss

Crisp contrast with improved cleanability.

CEILINGS

Flat

Low reflection helps ceilings feel calm.

FEATURE WALL

Color or texture

Use one focal surface with a clear purpose.

CABINETRY

Factory or shop-applied coating

A specified coating and sheen support daily handling.

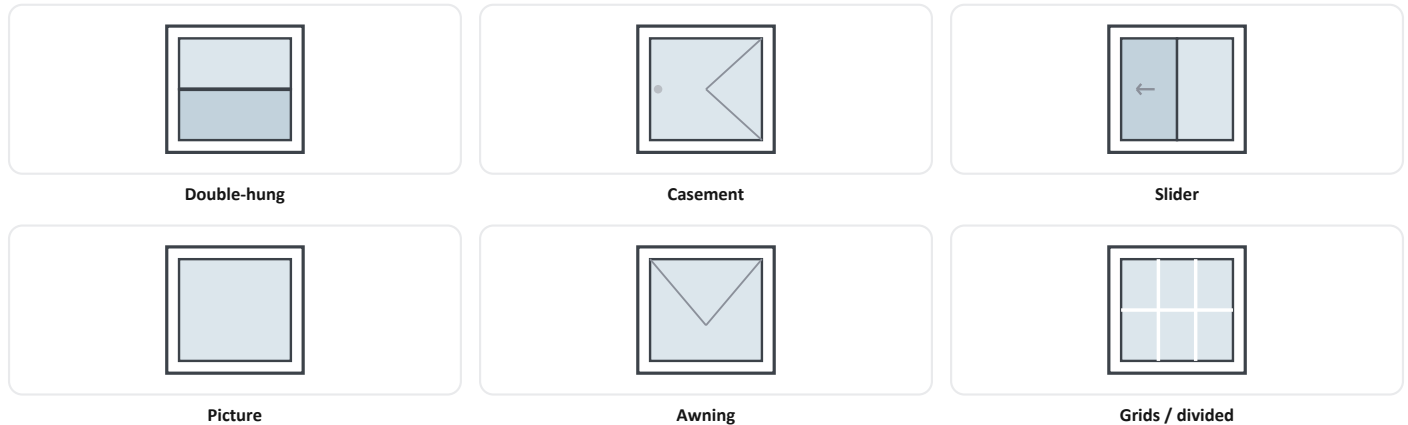
View large sample boards in morning, afternoon and evening light. Compare wall color beside flooring, cabinets and countertops.

Window type affects ventilation, furniture placement, exterior rhythm and cleaning access.

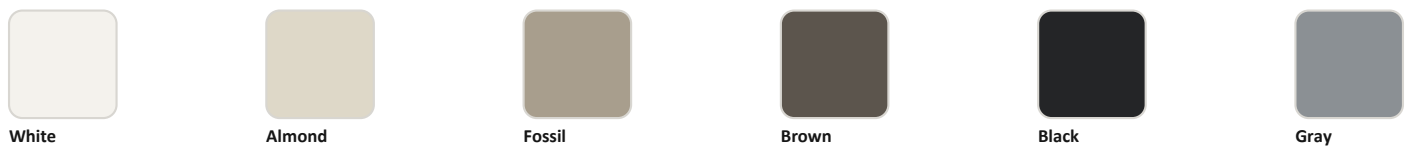

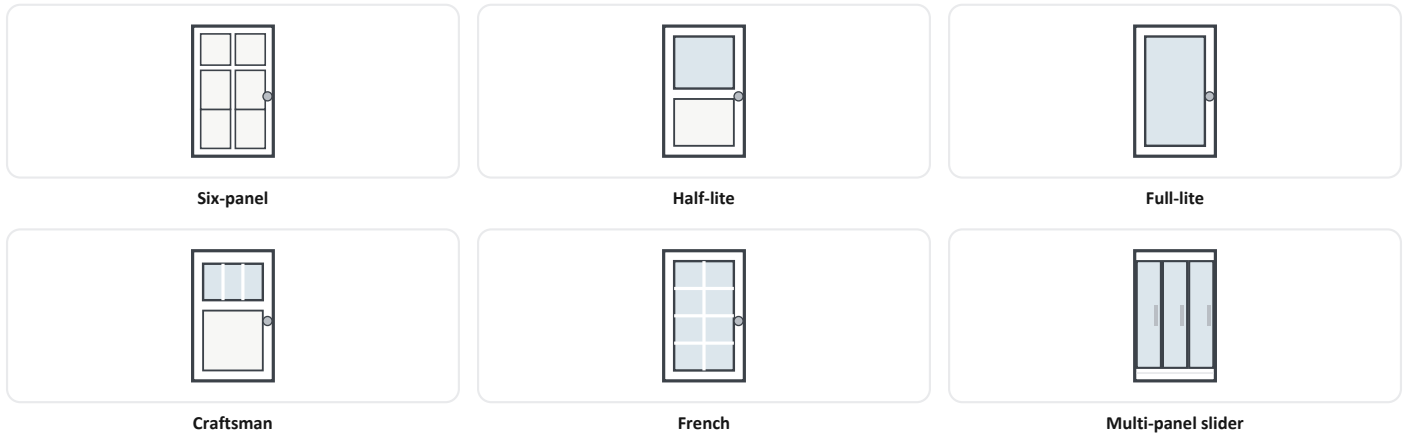

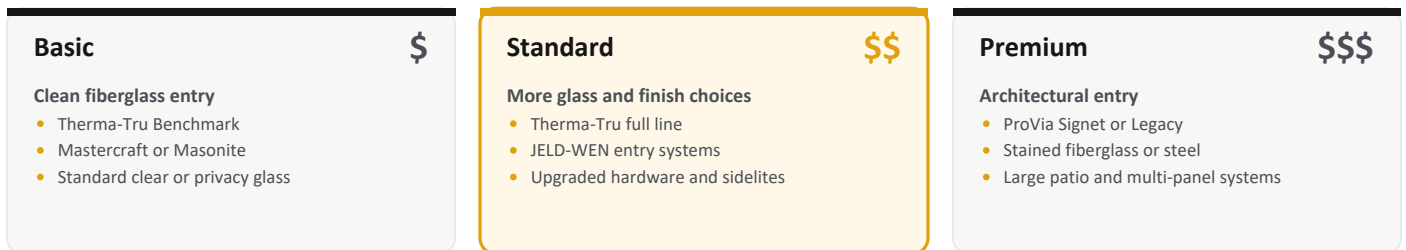
Exterior and patio doors

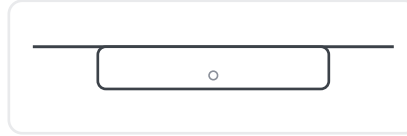

Approve slab, glass, frame color, sill, swing, lockset, deadbolt and exterior trim as one complete door system.

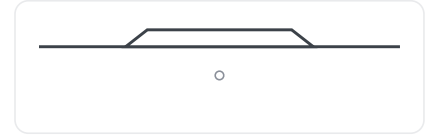

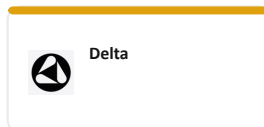

Coordinate behind the finish

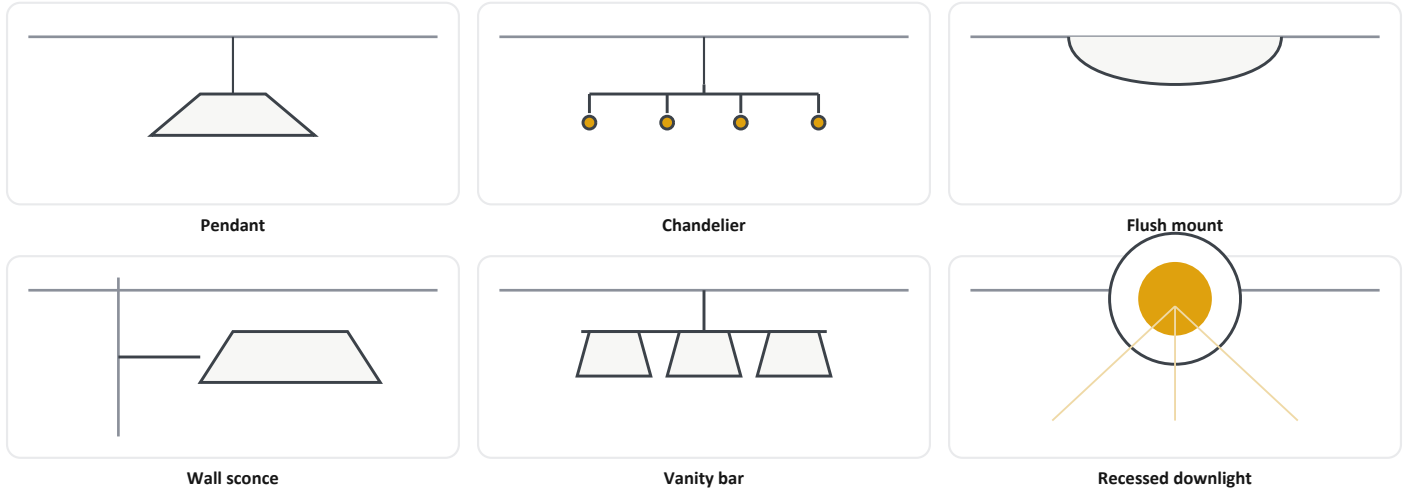
Record valve rough-ins, drain locations, waterproofing system, niche layout, accessory backing and service access before walls close.

11 LAYERED LIGHT

Lighting and electrical

Plan ambient, task and accent light together. Fixture finish then ties the layers into the palette.

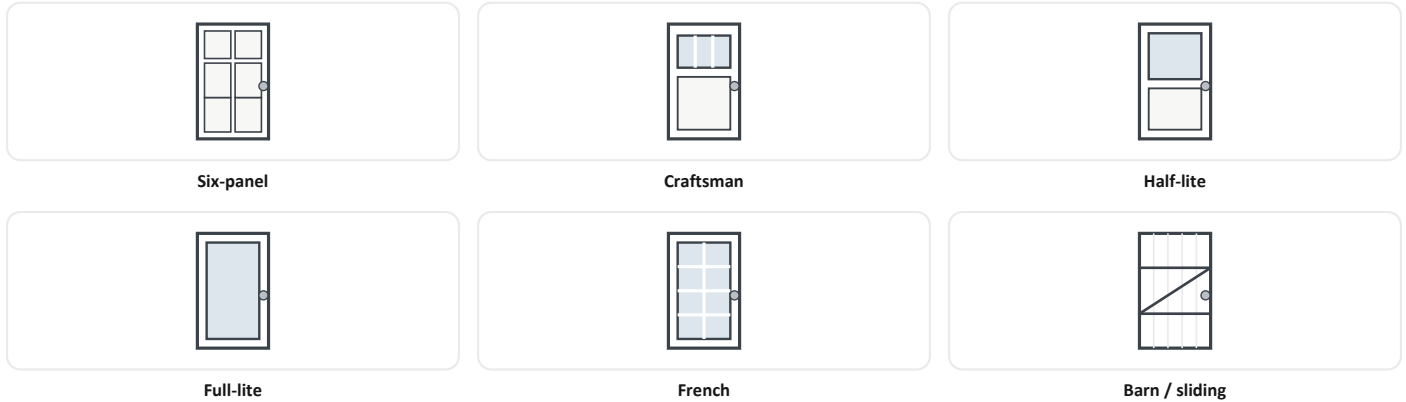

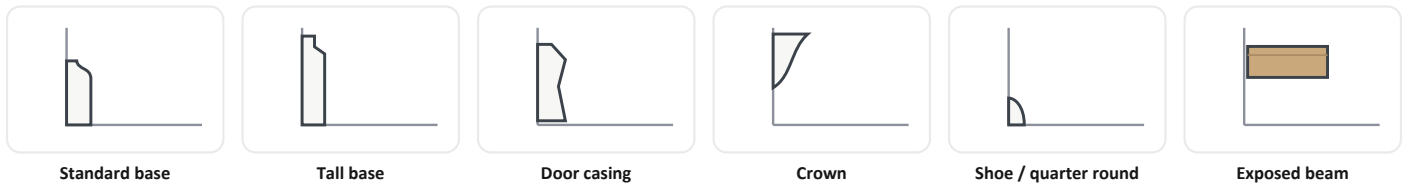
Interior doors, trim and hardware

Door profile, casing and baseboard create the repeated lines that make a home feel consistent.

Hardware finish directions



Repeat details intentionally

Carry one lever family, hinge finish and trim language through connected spaces. Use specialty hardware where the room earns it.

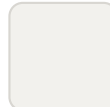

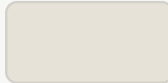

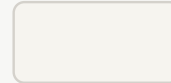

Suggested starting selections

- **Cabinets:** Painted shaker with a natural wood island
- **Counters:** Soft white quartz with warm movement
- **Floor:** Natural oak tone in a wide plank
- **Walls:** Warm white with subtle contrast at trim
- **Metal:** Champagne bronze with restrained black accents

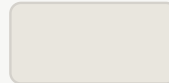

Suggested starting selections

- **Cabinets:** Muted sage or greige shaker
- **Counters:** Soft white surface with fine veining
- **Floor:** Driftwood or medium brown plank
- **Walls:** Balanced greige with soft white trim
- **Metal:** Aged bronze or matte black

Designer balance

Let one finish lead, one finish support and one finish provide contrast. Repeating every accent in equal amounts makes the palette feel busy.

15 PALETTE RECIPE

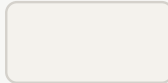
Classic Contrast

A crisp white foundation, dark focal point and warm wood floor create a strong architectural rhythm.

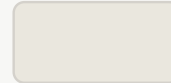

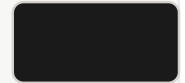

Suggested starting selections

- **Cabinets:** White shaker perimeter with charcoal island
- **Counters:** White quartz or honed black focal surface
- **Floor:** Natural white oak direction
- **Walls:** Soft white with a clean trim transition
- **Metal:** Matte black with limited polished chrome

Make the recipe personal

KEEP

The foundation

Protect the cabinet, floor and wall undertones that make the palette work.

CHANGE

One focal material

Swap the island, counter or backsplash to create a personal signature.

REPEAT

The finish language

Carry the selected metal and wood tone through connected rooms.

SAMPLE

In project lighting

Approve physical samples together during morning and evening conditions.

CONFIRM

Lead time and care

Balance appearance with maintenance, availability and replacement access.

RECORD

Exact selections

Write brand, collection, color, finish, quantity and approval date.
